How can we remain **accountable** to child survivors and those who care for them throughout the revision process?

Desk review of recent literature, inter-agency resources, and learning

DESK REVIEW

- Align with key resources (Case Management Guidelines)
- Account for specific considerations related to girls survivors
- Adapt to developmental stage
- Contextualize for diverse identities

FIELD CONSULTATIONS

- 215 respondents to a global survey
- 12 key informant interviews
- 6 focus group discussions
- 31 focus group discussions participants

FIELD VALIDATION

Lebanon: 36 adolescent girls, Libya: 16 adolescent boys South Sudan: 26 adolescent girls, 66 adolescent boys

Key recommendations:

- Follow-up on survivor and family.
- Guide survivor and family on how to behave following incident.
- Ensure survivor, family, community understand that the child is not to blame.

FIELD PILOTS & FACILITATED REVIEWS

Updated Training piloted/reviewed with **69 GBV and CP actors of 10 countries**



Guided by the field insights, the revised resource package:

- ▶ Focus on **key considerations in GBV and CP case management**
- ▶ Integrate a **gender-sensitive, intersectional, and inclusive lens**
- ▶ Provide specific **guidance to better serve adolescent girls**
- ▶ Provide detailed **guidance on staff supervision**
- ▶ Offer series of **practical exercises**
- ▶ Contain **advanced tools** for trainers
